CRITICAL MEDICINES

The Trust has an approved list of CRITICAL MEDICINES:

Anti-Coagulants

Anti-Convulsants for seizure control (including benzodiazepines for seizure termination)

Anti-Cancer drugs and the medication required to prevent their immediate side effects

Systemic Anti-Infectives (Oral, IV and IM formulations)

Anti-Parkinson's medication

Clozapine

Insulin and other anti-diabetic medication

Lithium

Systemic corticosteroids e.g. prednisolone, hydrocortisone, fludrocortisone <u>AND</u> high dose steroid inhalers

TIMELINESS OF ADMINISTRATION OF THESE MEDICATIONS IS CRUCIAL

ANY ACTION TAKEN DUE TO THE OMISSION OR DELAYED ADMINISTRATION OF THIS MEDICATION SHOULD BE RECORDED IN THE PATIENTS NOTES AND ON THE EPMA MAR CHART

Additional information:

All Critical medicines should be endorsed appropriately on the EPMAMAR charts with the words "CRITICAL MEDICINE" documented in the administration instructions of the prescription.

All oral anticonvulsants <u>AND</u> benzodiazepines prescribed for seizure termination (usually prescribed PRN) e.g. diazepam PR or midazolam S/L are critical.

Please note that a number of anti-convulsant medications are indicated for psychotropic use and they are only critical if prescribed for anti-convulsant purposes e.g. sodium valproate, lamotrigine, carbamazepine.

All formulations of systemic anti-infectives are regarded as critical: PO, IV, IM. This is excluding topical preparations e.g. fusidic acid cream.

Omission of these medicines can have a detrimental effect on a patient's condition leading to serious harm or death (NPSA/2010/RRR09). This list is not exhaustive as other medicines may be critical in specific circumstances and it is the prescriber's responsibility to make this clear on the prescription.
